“SKILL UP ACADEMY” –
A SUCCESS OF B4STUDENTS





“SKILL UP ACADEMY” A SUCCESS OF B4STUDENTS

B4Students program from Mane Foundation and its winning project, “Skill Up Academy,” finished a series of sessions aimed at developing life and professional skills for young people. The sessions featured experienced public figures who shared their knowledge. The final session was held at the Amphitheater of the University of Medicine in Tirana, with over 300 students attending. Special guest Blendi Fevziu, a well-known journalist, spoke on the topic “Secrets of Communication.” The program’s initiators, Armelda Ago, Armando Lekaj, and Esmeralda Sherifi, praised the sessions, calling them “a mix of hard work, creativity, and the desire to make a positive impact for the common good.” The goal of “Skill Up Academy” has always been to provide students with the life

skills and knowledge needed to succeed in the fast-changing job market.

THE GUESTS OF THE PREVIOUS SESSIONS AND THE TOPICS

The first session was led by journalist Marin Mema, who talked about “Leadership of the Future” and how leadership shapes the world. The second session was about money management, presented by Igli Tola. The third session, with Prof. Assoc. Dr. Mimoza Manxhari, focused on finding balance between study, work, and life. The second-to-last session featured politician Grida Duma, who discussed the importance of “Mindset” in achieving personal and professional goals.

#Here2Empower initiative, part of the B4Students program and supported by Mane Foundation, continues to bridge the gap between theory and practice by connecting students with real-world job market experiences through lectures delivered by BALFIN Group experts.

Twenty-five students from the “Physics and Computer Science” program at the Department of Physics were introduced to the concept of blockchain and its close connection to cryptography by Marlind Maksuti, Head of Software Development at the IT Department of BALFIN Group.

#HERE2EMPOWER AT FSHN: STUDENTS EXPLORE BLOCKCHAIN'S OPPORTUNITIES WITH MARLIND MAKSTI

Maksuti shared his insights on the practical applications of blockchain technology in the IT industry, emphasizing its rapid growth. He also explained how blockchain, in conjunction, provides significant opportunities for secure data storage, transactional functionalities, and management. The students expressed great interest and asked numerous questions about the challenges of blockchain technology.

#Here2Empower is one of the most important initiatives of the B4Students program, which for over a year has successfully built connections between BALFIN Group experts and students across the country.





CONNECTING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS WITH REAL WORLD RETAIL EXPERIENCES

B4Students has become a key bridge between education and market for students, offering valuable opportunities to connect classroom learning with real-world experience. A group of 50 students from Erhvervsakademi Aarhus University in Denmark visited the offices of leading retail companies within the BALFIN Group, including Neptun, Jumbo, Fashion Group Albania, and Spar.

This visit was part of an exchange program with the University of Tirana's Faculty of Economics. The students, who are pursuing a master's in international marketing, were

eager to explore leadership roles within the retail industry, ranging from Marketing and Sales to Social Media Management and Digital Marketing.

During their visit, the students had the chance to engage with managers and company representatives, gaining insights into how these companies operate and how marketing strategies are applied in Albania. They were particularly interested in understanding how consumer behavior in Albania compares to that of Denmark, and how marketing approaches differ in the two cultures.

The 13th edition of the National Entrepreneurship Festival – GEN-E Albania, organized by Junior Achievement of Albania was a mix of youthful energy, creativity, and innovation. At this event, filled with fresh ideas and passion for the future, Tirana Bank, demonstrated its commitment to financial education and empowering the new generation for the fourth consecutive year. This festival gathered 150 students from 41 high schools across Albania, who presented

26 companies conceived, built, and managed by themselves, as part of the "Student Companies" program. The "learning by doing" approach of this program serves as a lively laboratory for developing the entrepreneurial mindset that our country needs. The student prototypes were diverse: from digital applications and smart devices to handmade products, innovations in agriculture, and solutions for mental well-being. Ideas that show the future is in the safe hands.

Neptun and B4Students played a key role in supporting the Faculty of Economics' "Young Innovators." This initiative aimed to identify and nurture innovative ideas from students enrolled in the Innovation course. The event took the form of a "demo day," where students showcased their projects in front of a distinguished jury composed of industry professionals, including representatives from Neptun.

YOUNG INNOVATORS 2025

Neptun rewarded one of the winning teams and awarded a special prize to a female duo who presented the innovative "Smartbin" project, a smart waste management solution. In total, 13 diverse projects were presented, spanning fields such as tourism, environmental protection, technology, entertainment, and culinary arts.





BALFIN GROUP OPEN TO YOUNG TALENT

The Faculty of Architecture and Urban Planning at the Polytechnic University of Tirana welcomed Samir Mane for an inspiring session with students. A former student of the university himself, Mane shared his personal journey as an entrepreneur and the vision that has guided BALFIN Group's growth across Albania and beyond.

Mane emphasized that BALFIN projects are more than infrastructure investments; they

create both economic and social impact, at the local and national levels. The discussion also focused on opportunities for students to collaborate with BALFIN or explore professional paths within the Group, both in Albania and abroad.

Students actively engaged with the team, exploring topics such as urban development, contemporary architecture, and sustainable growth.



A MODERN LAB BY NEPTUN KOSOVA

Neptun Kosova is establishing a tradition in support of higher education in the country, and this year it cooperated with Mane Foundation to provide a new laboratory of information technology to the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, University of Prishtina.

It is a friendly space for the students of the Bachelor and Master Studies, to work on their academic projects in programming, CAD software, modelling, and simulation of various systems. This is an important contribution for the future professionals of technology.



ICEBIT 2025 BY FACULTY OF ECONOMY AND MANE FOUNDATION

Mane Foundation supported the International Conference on Economy, Business, Innovation, and Technology (ICEBIT 2025), organized by the Faculty of Economy, University of Tirana. The conference brought together academics, researchers, and industry leaders to discuss how innovation and digital transformation are shaping modern economies.

Elvin Nosi, HR Director of BALFIN Group, highlighted the importance of stronger cooperation between universities and businesses, and the need to prepare students with practical skills that match today's job market.





CONTEMPORARY DIALOGUE IN ARCHITECTURE, URBANISM, AND HERITAGE

The Faculty of Architecture and Urban Planning, Polytechnic University of Tirana, hosted the fifth edition of the International Forum on Architecture and Urbanism, titled “Power, Space, and Culture”. It discussed how power manifests spatially; how architectural and planning practices can reproduce or disrupt hierarchies; and how cultural

narratives are constructed, preserved, or contested in the urban realm. Mane Foundation took care of an exhibition that the organizers set up to illustrate the main topic of the activity. Balfin Development, a company of BALFIN Group, was invited to showcase how it combines architecture and heritage.



A DICTIONARY OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY BY MANE FOUNDATION

"The Dictionary of Information Technology" is a publication designed to support students as well as all those passionate about specialized terms and expressions that today are widely used by the public. This dictionary is an in-depth study with 6,000 words, offering both

English-Albanian and Albanian-English translations.

This work, the result of several years of research by Erion Çano, an expert in computational linguistics, and Edmond Tupja, a linguist and translator.





RICIKLO KREATIV: FROM STUDENTS TO TEG

The international architecture competition "Riciklo Kreativ" promotes creativity and sustainability through the transformation of materials into artistic works and unique installations.

It is the fourth consecutive year that TEG hosts this fruitful collaboration with Mane Foundation, and the Faculty of Architecture and Urban Planning in Tirana. University students from

various countries of the region submitted their designs of lighting devices that are made of reused and recycled raw materials. Their creations combine art, architecture, and environmental awareness, offering visitors an inspiring experience of sustainable design.

A selected jury awarded prizes to the best projects.

NOBODY WITH SPECIAL NEEDS IN ALBANIA WILL BE WITHOUT A WHEELCHAIR!

Mane Foundation, in collaboration with "Fundjavë Ndryshe" Foundation, has launched an initiative to provide wheelchairs to all individuals with paraplegia and tetraplegia in Albania. Initially, 260 wheelchairs were distributed in Tirana, then some other 200 wheelchairs went to this community in Vlora, with the goal of distributing a total of 1,000 wheelchairs nationwide.

The founder of Mane Foundation, Samir Mane, emphasized that the distribution of wheelchairs to people with paraplegia and tetraplegia is both

a foundation commitment and a personal one. "I am sure this is only the first step. I promise that Mane Foundation will continue its work so that all individuals with paraplegia and tetraplegia in Albania will have a wheelchair and the independence and ease they have been lacking," said Samir Mane.

Mane, who is also the founder of BALFIN Group, added that this initiative is another effort to ensure a dignified life for all individuals with paraplegia and tetraplegia, particularly those facing economic hardships.




MANE FOUNDATION IMPROVES CHEMOTHERAPY CARE CONDITIONS AT THE ONCOLOGY HOSPITAL IN TIRANA

The Oncology Hospital of "Mother Teresa" University Hospital Center in Tirana, the central point of cancer treatment in the country, has significantly improved thanks to the support from Mane Foundation. It has provided 30 brand new chemotherapy chairs and helped to totally renovate the premises.

With the new chairs and better conditions, the hospital can now treat

approximately 100 patients per day, accomodating all the actual needs.

The initiative reflects the Foundation's mission to strengthen health and well-being within the community by addressing critical needs and delivering immediate, measurable improvements in people's daily lives.



MANE FOUNDATION SUPPORTS PEOPLE WITH MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS WITH A NEW REHABILITATION CENTER



People living with multiple sclerosis now have a dedicated place in Tirana where they can receive specialized care and rehabilitation, thanks to the support of the Mane Foundation. The new center offers a combination of manual and equipment-based

physical therapies designed to help patients maintain mobility and improve their overall well-being. Each patient can attend three physiotherapy sessions per week, all fully covered for a year, ensuring continuous and consistent care.



MANE FOUNDATION AND NEPTUN KOSOVA SUPPORT THE ONCOLOGY HOSPITAL IN KOSOVO, CONTINUING A LONG-TERM COMMITMENT TO CANCER CARE

Mane Foundation equipped the Oncology Hospital of the University Clinical Center of Kosova with IT infrastructure. New and upgraded laptops now make it easier for the personnel to better organize the workflow, resulting in shorter waiting time for the patients.

Neptun Kosova has been cooperating with the doctors, and the result is a manageable schedule of visits, benefitting the patients and the workforce as well.





A NEW BEGINNING FOR A SPECIALIZED THERAPY CENTER

The Services Center for People with Disabilities, managed by Down Syndrome Albania Foundation, was inaugurated, and the ceremony was attended by the founder of Mane Foundation, Samir Mane, who has supported this initiative from day one.

People with disabilities from across Albania will continue to have a dedicated space where they can receive specialized support and care, thanks to the support of Mane Foundation.

The center provides support to individuals across the full spectrum of disabilities, not only those with Down syndrome. Currently, over 30 children benefit from its programs, many of whom receive free therapy, giving them the opportunity to develop their potential in a safe and stimulating environment.





EQUIPMENT TO PRISHTINA PEDIATRIC HOSPITAL



Jumbo Kosovo has completed a significant donation to the Pediatric Hospital in Prishtina. This initiative focuses on two key areas that directly affect children's health and development: Hemato-Oncology and Speech Therapy (Logopedia). The Hemato-Oncology department received modern medical equipment to support around 400 children, helping improve both the quality of care and the efficiency of daily treatments. This

contribution strengthens the hospital's ability to provide critical services for children with hematological and oncological conditions. The Speech Therapy service received a range of educational and therapeutic materials, including books, games, and assistive tools. These resources will be used across 480 therapy sessions per month, benefiting 72 children, and creating a more engaging and effective environment for their development.



JUMBO CONTRIBUTES TO EARLY DETECTION OF VISION ISSUES IN CHILDREN

Jumbo, in partnership with the Mane Foundation has donated a Refractokeratometer, an advanced eye examination device, to the Children's Hospital in Podgorica. This valuable contribution enables the hospital's ophthalmology department to conduct more precise and comfortable vision screenings for young patients. The refractometer uses advanced technology to accurately measure the eye's focusing ability and determine the appropriate corrective lenses needed for clear vision.





ANOTHER KINDERGARTEN PLAYGROUND FROM JUMBO IN MONTENEGRO

The playground of the kindergarten in Bijelo Polje has undergone a major renovation, making it a safe and inspiring space for over 120 children. Bright colors, modern play structures, and carefully designed areas encourage creativity and social interaction, giving children the freedom to explore, learn, and grow in an appropriate environment.





FIVE YEARS OF COMMITMENT TO CHILDREN'S WELLBEING



For five consecutive years, Neptun Macedonia has remained committed to creating a positive social impact within the local community, with a strategic focus on supporting children without parental care.

It implemented the "EcoTech Challenge," an educational and creative initiative developed in partnership with "Donate a Computer," the Primary School "Gjorgjija Pulevski," and SOS Children's Village. Through a series of interactive workshops, children and students reused obsolete computer components to create innovative projects, promoting digital literacy, creativity, and environmental awareness through responsible reuse of technology.



The company continued its support and sponsorship of IT4Charity 2025, reinforcing its commitment to leveraging technology and innovation for social good and inclusive community development.

Year after year, Neptun Macedonia has implemented the "Round Up Your Bill" donation campaign, conducted from 1 September to 15 December. This initiative enables customers to become part of Neptun's social projects by voluntarily rounding up the value of their purchases at Neptun stores and donating the difference. The funds raised contributed directly to improving care conditions and overall wellbeing of children at SOS Children's Village.





MULTIMEDIA HUB FOR HARD-OF-HEARING PUPILS

Employees of Neptun Albania put their heart to a project benefitting a unique institution in the country. The Institute of Hard-of-Hearing Pupils is a public institution dedicated to children and young people with hearing difficulty. Its students are now acquiring digital and creative skills that help them in their learning process and provide greater possibilities for inclusion in society.

This is exactly what the Multimedia Hub in the premises of this institution is established for. With the specialized support from Beyond Barriers organization, and in cooperation with Mane Foundation, it is now producing educational content for those frequenting the institution. Soon, this content will be available even to students that are enrolled in other schools.



JOY TO CHILDREN IN SHORT AND LONG TERM

Kiabi and representatives of UNICEF Albania representatives brought joy to children of the Daily Care Center for Children with Disabilities in Vlora, where more than 40 children receive daily care, therapy, and support.

This initiative is part of a partnership between Mane Foundation and UNICEF Albania to advance children's rights through long-term projects and fundamental improvement in foster care.



Tirana Bank, in partnership with Mane Foundation and Save the Children Albania, has launched an important initiative in support of education and environmental protection. "Eco Schools," launched at the "Rilindja" school in Vlora, aimed to inspire the younger generation for a more sustainable future and raise community awareness about the importance of environmental protection.

ECO SCHOOLS: TIRANA BANK INVESTS IN A MORE SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

As part of this initiative, the children of the Ecological Club learned and practiced using equipment to measure air quality, gaining practical knowledge about the impact of pollution on health and the environment. These activities help them understand the importance of measurements for improving the quality of life and encourage them to act as catalysts for change in their families and communities.

ADigital Perspective – an exhibition that was too cool to miss

For the first time, ADigital Perspective brought together ten emerging artists from Italy and the Balkans, offering a perspective both similar and distinct on art and the impact of digital technologies.

It was part of a cultural project organized by the Italian Cultural Institutes of Tirana, Belgrade, and Bucharest, and its displayed works are as diverse as the techniques used, including installation art, painting, photography, and more, despite their analog roots.



“SHOT / REVERSE SHOT” A dialogue across time at GOCAT

This exhibition connected the powerful black-and-white imagery of Barry Lewis, the British photojournalist who captured Albania in the early 1990s, with new responses by four Albanian artists today.

The title of the exhibition, borrowed from cinema, suggests a visual back-and-forth: one image speaks, another responds. The result is not just a look into the past, but a moment of reflection on identity and memory.



“LIFE AND DEATH”

Faton Kryeziu's deeply personal reflections on the pain and resilience of the Kosovo War

The title itself says a lot – this exhibition explored the duality of life and death, the weight these two ideas carry for human beings, and the undeniable truth that both the beginning and the end of our journey are beyond any mystery. Faton Kryeziu presented his personal experiences during and after the Kosovo War.

The exhibition featured 25 paintings, all expressing a balance of deep thought, color, and figurative content.



"MEDITERRANEA"

The opening of the much-anticipated "Mediterranea – The Visions of an Ancient and Complex Sea" exhibition at GOCAT Gallery in Tirana was nothing short of spectacular. The exhibition, a collaboration between the Mane Foundation and the Italian Institute of Culture, offers a multi-dimensional journey into the history, beauty, and myths of the Mediterranean. Visitors are treated to a fascinating mix of space images, ancient artworks, and interactive installations.

Before arriving in Tirana, the "Mediterranea" exhibition had already been showcased in Valencia, Spain, and traveled across the Mediterranean. Tirana serves as the final stop before the exhibition returns to Rome.



Step Into the present “HERE AND NOW”

“Here and Now” was a fascinating exhibition by Verim Zendeli from North Macedonia. This project marked an exciting step in Zendeli’s artistic journey and offered a deep, personal reflection on the moment we live in.

Inspired by the philosophical ideas of Walter Benjamin, who described “here” and “now” as metaphors for space, time, and originality, the exhibition explores how memory, identity, and today’s social realities intersect. Visitors experienced a layered story where personal and collective histories come alive through art that invites curiosity and dialogue.



BEYOND THE SCREEN: NEPTUN KOSOVA AT THE HEART OF PRIFEST 2025

Prishtina turned into a capital of cinema once more this September with the 17th edition of PriFest – Prishtina International Film Festival, and Neptun Kosova was right at the heart of it. Since 2022, Neptun Kosova has been by PriFest's side, helping one of the region's most renowned festivals bring the magic of cinema to Kosovo. Four editions later, the partnership feels less like sponsorship and more like a shared mission: to amplify stories, give young talent a platform, and connect Kosovo's creative scene with the international stage.

This year, Neptun Kosova had the honor of awarding the “Best Pitch” prize to “The General and the Butterfly”. The project stood out for its authenticity and artistic strength, but also for its profound message: that beyond wars, conflicts, and divisions, there is always room for hope and humanity.






WEST PARK ALBANIA BRINGS TO LIFE 'COLORS OF THE WESTERN BALKANS'

West Park Albania, became the meeting point for Western Balkans artists, who gathered in the city of Korça to explore the role of art in preserving cultural heritage and fostering regional cooperation. Twenty artists from Albania, Kosovo, North Macedonia,
